Memorandum of call from Dr. Hector P. Garcia concerning complaint by Mr. Sabas Gonzales alleging violation of his civil rights.

At approximately 12:30 P.M., March 24, 1969, Dr. Hector P. Garcia called me in reference to a complaint brought to his attention by one Mr. Sabas Gonzales, a citizen of the United States, Texas, and resident of Corpus Christi. According to Dr. Garcia, Mr. Gonzales applied for a position as a pumper offered by the Public Works Department, City of Corpus Christi. The job was given to a Mr. Garland Barmore. Mr. Gonzales was told by Mr. McDaniel of Public Works, that he did not get the position because he suffered from hypertension. Mr. Gonzales denies that he suffers from this, and Dr. Garcia would offer to confirm this fact too. In this respect, Mr. Gonzales feels that his civil rights have been violated and he sought Dr. Garcia's Delp and assistance in this matter.

Dr. Garcia emphasized that he is acting purely as a private fitizen and not as a Commissioner of the Civil Rights Condission, but he did feel that perhaps there was a need for an explanation and investigation into the practices of the Civil Service Commission. He further requests that Mr. Barmore's appointment not be confirmed until he has had an opportunity to see you.

Dr. Garcia stated that normally yould bring this matter to your attention directly, but he was leaving for Washingt ().C. at 2:15 this plate, and this was not possible. Dr. Garcia will return by Thurson at which time he will seek an appointment with you to discuss this matter in greater detail.
