I would like to ask you to send me some material regarding the Mexican -American dicrimination problems in our country and any recorded cases regarding Mexican-American Soldiers. I recall that while I was on leave some time ago you asked me if I thought that there exsisted any discrimination against the Mexican-American and I can honstly say yes.

We have met with the Depuy Post Commander, Col E F Mills, and he has assured me that the Army has its discrimination problems just as the civilian community and that it is up to leaders like myself to under--stand and slove them and creat a better ratal harmony within the Army.

I can assure you Doc, that I will not play the role of a Tio Tomas" or Uncle Tom as the white folks say it and I will need your help and your support in my saff work since the Post Commander, wants us to keep him informed on the racial situiation here at Fort Campbell.
