Dear Mr. Mobley;

It appears to me that Mrs. Jovita Ramirez is not receiving the full protection of her rights. She says that she is not finding guidance and cooperation in her case.

She bluntly states that where a complaint made by an anglo against her son, Rodolfo, was accepted in spite of no evidence, that a complaint she is trying to make against several men was rejected.

She believes that the police should have taken some action when her house was broken in when she was threatened and that she is still harassed by those young people.

Mrs. Ramirez believes that the police acted in favor of the anglos while ignoring her rights.

This case calls for a complete investigation and if necessary a conference should be called. It is indeed a terrible situation when minority groups feel that the law is interpreted differently against minority group members and in favor of majority group.

Certainly it is hard for me to believe that no one law enforcement agency has taken any action against the invasion of this family's rights and property and failed in protecting their rights.

The charges against her son Rodolfo, have been twisted and changed. Of course I know that Rodolfo had a previous record. Please keep me informed of the results.
