SUBJECT: 33rd Annual Meeting and Dinner

"THE CIVIL RIGHTS CHALLENGE FOR THE 80'S: EQUAL ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY" will be the theme of the 33rd Annual Meeting of the Leadership Conference scheduled for Monday and Tuesday, January 24 and 25, 1983 at the Capital Hilton Hotel, Washington, D.C.

On Monday, panelists will explore the theme in a series of workshops to focus on jobs, segregation in housing and education and economic equity issues for women. Experts in these areas will be among the guest speakers.

Fortuitously, the two day meeting coincides with the opening of the 98th Congress. Thus, on the second day, Tuesday, January 25, LCCR will present to the Congress and to the press its 1983 legislative agenda at a special breakfast on Capitol Hill for Conference delegates and Congressional members and staff. Extra effort will be made to have all the newly elected members of Congress join us for breakfast. We encourage you to set up individual meetings with your Representative and Senators.

A highlight of the Annual Meeting will be the presentation of the Hubert H. Humphrey Civil Rights Award to Douglas Fraser, President of the International Union, United Automobile Workers and Rosina Tucker, a 101 year old civil rights/labor activist, on Monday evening, January 24 in the ballroom.

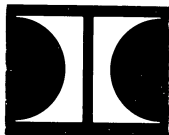
