## Yale honors Dr. Hector Garcia

Yale University has established an endowed chair in Chicano studies in honor of American G.I. Forum founder Dr. Hector P. Garcia of Corpus Christi.

The endowed chair is part of the Ivy League university's new Chicano Research Center, established last summer, that will focus on the history and accomplishments of Hispanics in the United States.

"The reason Dr. Garcia was picked was because of his involvement, throughout his life, in the advancement of Hispanics, especially in education," said Zaragosa Vargas yesterday in a telephone interview.

Vargas is an assistant professor and director of the Chicano Research Center at Yale.

"I'm certainly grateful and hon-

ored and humbled," said Garcia.
"This is an honor that is bestowed upon this community too."

"This is where I live. This is my home and I'm proud of it," the physician said of Corpus Christi.

Garcia said he hoped this latest award would serve as motivation for young Hispanics. Last year, he received the Presidential Medal of Freedom from Ronald Reagan.

"I hope this will encourage more young people to achieve recognition and get involved," he said.

Garcia has had some involvement with the New Haven, Conn., school. He visited there last year at the invitation of Corpus Christi natives affiliated with the university. Garcia addressed students and faculty on his activities in the battle for equal rights.

Through the Hector P. Garcia Endowed Chair, an Hispanic scholar

will be invited each year to teach and participate in all aspects of Yale University life, Vargas said.

David Avalos of Seton Hall University will be the first to hold the chair during the 1985-86 academic year, Vargas said. Avalos has been a visiting lecturer in sociology at Yale for several years.

Besides the endowed chair in Garcia's honor, the new Chicano Research Center has established a literary journal, a research journal and a dissertation fellowship in honor of Yale graduate Joaquin Avila, president and general counsel of MALDEF.

The center also has asked Garcia to consider Yale as a repository for his personal papers and correspondence.

Garcia said this is being considered, but no decision has been made yet.
