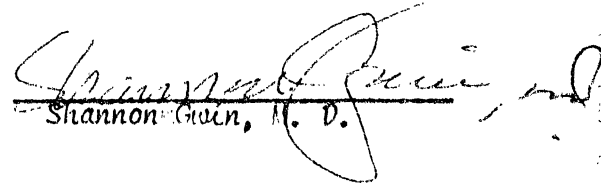
TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

The above patient, twenty year old female, was examined by me on June 9, 1975.

She stated that she had been quite tense, nervous, and upset when subjected to stress associated with any significant responsibilities or decisions. Patient has been married to her present husband approximately four years and has one three year old child. The child is described as being quite hyperactive and the patient states that she is incapable of managing him without help.

My impression after examination was that this patient represented a somewhat immature character structure with an hysterical personality. In view of this difficulty it is felt that there would be a good probability of her decompensating if she were forced to make decisions and assume responsibilities without considerable support. By virtue of this need it would be most preferable if her husband could be either with her or close by to fulfill these needs.
