

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD SUBJECT: Mr. Andrew Mathis

On 24 April 86, as I was approaching my desk I observed trash around it. I had seen this type of trash on and around Mr. Andrew Mathis' desk previously. Mr. Mathis is suppose to be Production Controller of shop 5DB3H. On a different occassion, I talked to Mr. Jose Rodriguez, Mr. Mathis' leader and Mr. Guadalupe Salazar, his supervisor. told them that Mr. Mathis' area was untidy and full of trash. My supervisor had gotten on to me because he thought it was my area also. Apparently, Mr. Mathis' supervisors addressed him because he made a feeble attempt to clean but piled all the trash in the fire lane and left it there. I asked Mr. Mathis why he had done that and he told me "to fuck myself." I told him that I did not like a disorderly place and that all the people in my area cleaned up after themselves. He proceeded to use profane and abusive language to the effect of, "you mother fucker, make me do it if you can." At that I told him to watch his language because that was very unprofessional and unbecoming of his position. He persisted in using the same vulgar language and again I asked him to stop. He then called me "an asshole and a mother fucker" and edged and taunted me. I told him I would not lose my job on account of him. He threatened me by saying, "I'll catch you some other place outside and beat the shit out of you." I became concerned and walked away. As I was walking away, he again used profanity and called me "an asshole mother fucker and that he would catch me later." I related this to Mr. Mike Ramirez my boss and he said that he would talk to Mr. Salazar.
