I am Antonio Sisneros, a former member of the American GI Forum. I became involved with the Forum as an employee of SER in Colorado. I realized the significance of the Forum and what it had to offer as a community based organization.

At the present time I am working towards the Ph.D. in Political Science, concentrating in Public Administration, Public Policy and Public Law, at Washington State University.
