Pursuant to complaints you have received from voters in San Patricio County, you asked me to look into the County's election structure for possible voter rights violations. The litigation staff has completed its preliminary analysis:

San Patricio

Population - 47,288 - (%) Spanish Surnames - 49.1% Spanish Surnames - County Commissioners - 1

Our findings suggest a possible violation of the one-man one-vote rule. Precinct 2 has a total population of 14,486, whereas precinct 3 has a population of 8,264.; top to bottom deviation from the ideal is 52.63%. The County Clerk told me the last time the County was reapportioned was in 1969.

Further, our fifth count data indicates that San Patricio County may be gerryman-dered in such a way that the voting strength of the minority population is diluted. The precincts break down as follows:

It is my feeling that new districts could be drawn that would comply with the constitutional one-man one-vote rule and make it possible for the minorities of San Patricio County to elect two County Commissioners.

My recommendation at this point is that a meeting be arranged between the legal staff and the people from San Patricio County who have complained. At this meeting we can present our findings and the legal alternatives available.

Dear Mr. Rodriguez:

Enclosed please find a copy of our preliminary analysis of the commissioner precincts of San Patricio County (Attachment 1). Also, for your convenience, I have included a map of the commissioners precincts (Attachment 2).

As you can see, there may be a violation of the one-man one vote rule. The ideal district should have a population of 11,822, yet precinct 2 has a population of 14,486 and precinct 3 has a population of 8,264. This produces a top to bottom deviation of 52.63%.

As you may know, case law permits at the most a 15% deviation.

Furthermore, observe that precinct 3 is 69.26% Spanish surname, but an anglo named Glen Dorris is the county commissioner. This same precinct, however, has the lowest population, 8,264; it deviates from the ideal by 30.1%. A reapportionment may be necessary to further strengthen the minority vote in precinct 3.

As I mentioned to you on the phone, upon closer scrutiny we may find out that the present plan works to the advantage of the Hispanic community. To find this out, when we have our meeting, I would like to focus on the following matters: 1) What are your opinions on the current plan? 2) Could better lines be drawn?

3) What do you see are the problems with precinct 3? 4) Do you feel a registration drive would be helpful?

I look forward to hearing from you on when I can meet with you and other local leaders.
