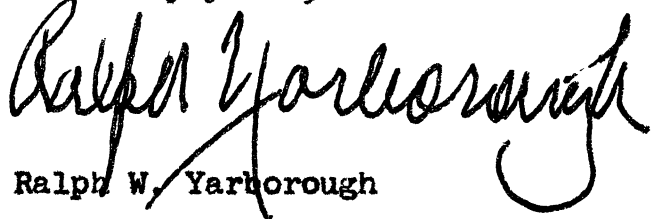
Dear Mr. Garcia:

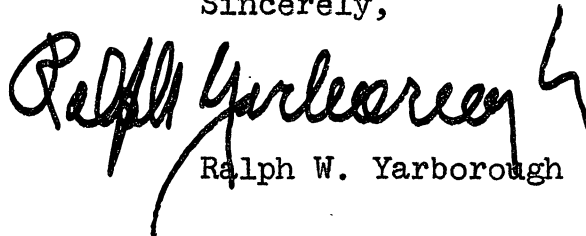
