


Dear Dr. Hector:

With further reference to the case of Specialist Four Roberto Garcia, I am enclosing a copy of a telegram that I received today that is in answer to a previous inquiry I had made in behalf of SP/4 Garcia at the request of his wife who at that time was living in Denbeigh, Virginia.

Inasmuch as Specialist Four Garcia has been sent to Vietnam and his request for a compassionate reassignment has been denied, if the family situation has worsened, he could apply for a hardship discharge. 
Dear Dr. Hector:
