Dear Friend:

The Texas Farm Workers Union cordially invites you to be with us on March 10th and be one of the speakers at the rally to be held on behalf of H.B. 227, Agricultural Labor Relations Bill, on the steps of the State Capitol in Austin.

The rally will also mark the culmination of our "MARCH FOR EQUALITY" of qpproximately 600 miles which began on January 27 in Muleshoe, Texas.

As we had previously informed you, H.B. 227, if passed by the state legislature will give collective bargaining rights to farm workers in Texas. At the present time, only two states, California and Hawaii, have legislation of this type. As a consequence, the majority of the farm workers, and especially those from Texas, are working under deplorable conditions and a very low standard of living. This is why the TFW is attempting to mobilize public opinion in support of H.B. 227 through the "MARCH FOR EQUALITY" and its culmination at the rally on March 10 in Austin.

The rally is scheduled to begin at 2:00 p.m. We hope that we can count on your presence in support of H.B. 227 and the cause of the farm worker in Texas.

Your response will be greatly appreciated. Hoping that we are too far from the day when understanding, justice and peace will be with us.

NEWSLETTER NO. 3 MARCH, 1979

NOTE: This is the third in a series of newsletters concerning the 1979 Legislation Campaign for Farm Workers. Through this newsletters we hope to keep all members, supporters and sympathizers informed about the current developments regarding the efforts of the TEXAS FARM WORKERS UNION to enact laws in Texas which will benefit the farm workers.

On the loth of March, the "March for Equality" of the Texas Farm Workers Union will reach its destination in Austin, Texas, with a rally to be held in front of the Capitol building.

At the end of the march that day, the farm workers will have walked over 500 miles (more than 1,000 kilometers), walking tirelessly day by day regardless of the climate and other factors, in a desperate effort to mobilize the attempts and support for the passage of the H.B. 227 (Agricultural Relations Bill).

The march that started the 27th of January in Muleshoe, Texas, represents an interest not only to expose the negative conditions in which the workers live in the farm camps in the state, but that the government realize the objectives of the farm worker who cannot count on the right of collective bargaining.


The H.B. 227, a bill introduced in December to the House of Representatives by A.C. "Tony" Garcia of Pharr and Paul Moreno of El Paso, was submitted for consideration to the Committee of Agriculture and Livestock, the majority being composed of representatives who are not very sympathetic with the farm workers and the problems with which these workers are confronted.

At the time this newsletter is being written, the farm workers were still a couple of days from Ft. Worth-Dallas. From there they will arrive in Waxahachie the 28th of February. The 1st of March they will be in Hillsboro, the 3rd in Waco and the 6th in Temple. And finally on the 10th, the marchers will arrive in Austi

In Austin, on the 10th, the march will start at 9:00 in the morning at the corner of Lamar Boulevard and Loeing Street. At that intersection, there is a big open-lot where they will gather to walk the last trek of their march. We urge the public to join the march at this place. The marchers will start walking through Lamar Boulevard heading south until reaching Guadalupe Street. The marchers will follow Guadalupe Street until reaching 7th street where they turn east till Congress Avenue, turning towards the north to the grounds of the State Capitol.

There will be a meeting in favor of House Bill 227 in which Represe tatives Tony Garcia, Paul Moreno, Antonio Orendain, leader of the Texas Farm Workers Union and other civic labor leaders will be speakers. This meeting will start at approximately 2:00 pm and it will terminate at 3:00 pm. From there, they will move to Water Loop Park at East 13th St. At the park, there will be speeches, food and refreshments will be served to the participants. The day after, there will be entertainment in honor of the participants of the march where Estevan Jordan will perform. 
