Dear Mr. Morales:

The Comprehensive Employment and Training Act of 1973 provides elected officials with new challenges and opportunities for leadership in meeting the manpower development needs of our State. An important element of this new manpower planning and programming system is the establishment of a State Manpower Services Council which shall assist me in fulfilling my responsibilities as State prime sponsor. To complement the involvement of elected officials, I am asking that you, representing a community based organization, accept my appointment as a member of this important Council. This appointment is effective immediately for a term extending through December, 1974.

It is my intent that the State Manpower Services Council will be the primary mechanism for coordinating the efforts of State and local leaders in addressing problems of mutual concern and for bringing to bear both private and public resources to meet our common needs. Consequently, I have appointed General James M. Rose, Director of the Division of Planning Coordination, to represent me as Chairman of the Council. Please notify him at your earliest convenience (512/475/2427) of your acceptance of this appointment.
