BIOGRAPHIC SKETCH FRANK V. ORTIZ, JR.

Mr. Ortiz is a career Foreign Service Officer. He was born in Santa Fe, New Mexico, and is 38 years old. Mr. Ortiz was graduated from Georgetown University where he majored in Foreign Service. He has also studied at the University of New Mexico, the University of Madrid, and the American University of Beirut.
