Dear Fr. Luna.

This will acknowledge our conversation of November 12. 1961 regarding your eligibility for Jury Service.

We definitely accept Mr. De Anda's conclusion as to the qualification for jury service and if you meet these qualifications then we certaily agree that you are eligible for jury service.

I believe you are in error if you are under the impression that you are PREVENTED from jury service by virtue of membership in the National Guard and I also believe that the fletter written in your behalf was mis-interpreted if it was read to believe that Guard membership prevented jury service.

For your information we cite Article 5842 and 5843 of the Revised Civil Statutes of Texas (Vernon's Civil Statutes) whereby active Guard membership permits jury EXEMPTION. We do not feel that the word EXEMPTION is synonymous with PREVENTION. The Statutes also give you a poll tax EXEMPTION and I feel sure that you understand that this exemption does not prevent you from voting.

I am enclosing an extra copy of this letter so that you can send Mr. De Anda a copy. I sincerely hope this clears up any misunderstanding between you and Mr De Anda regarding your eligibility for Jury service.
