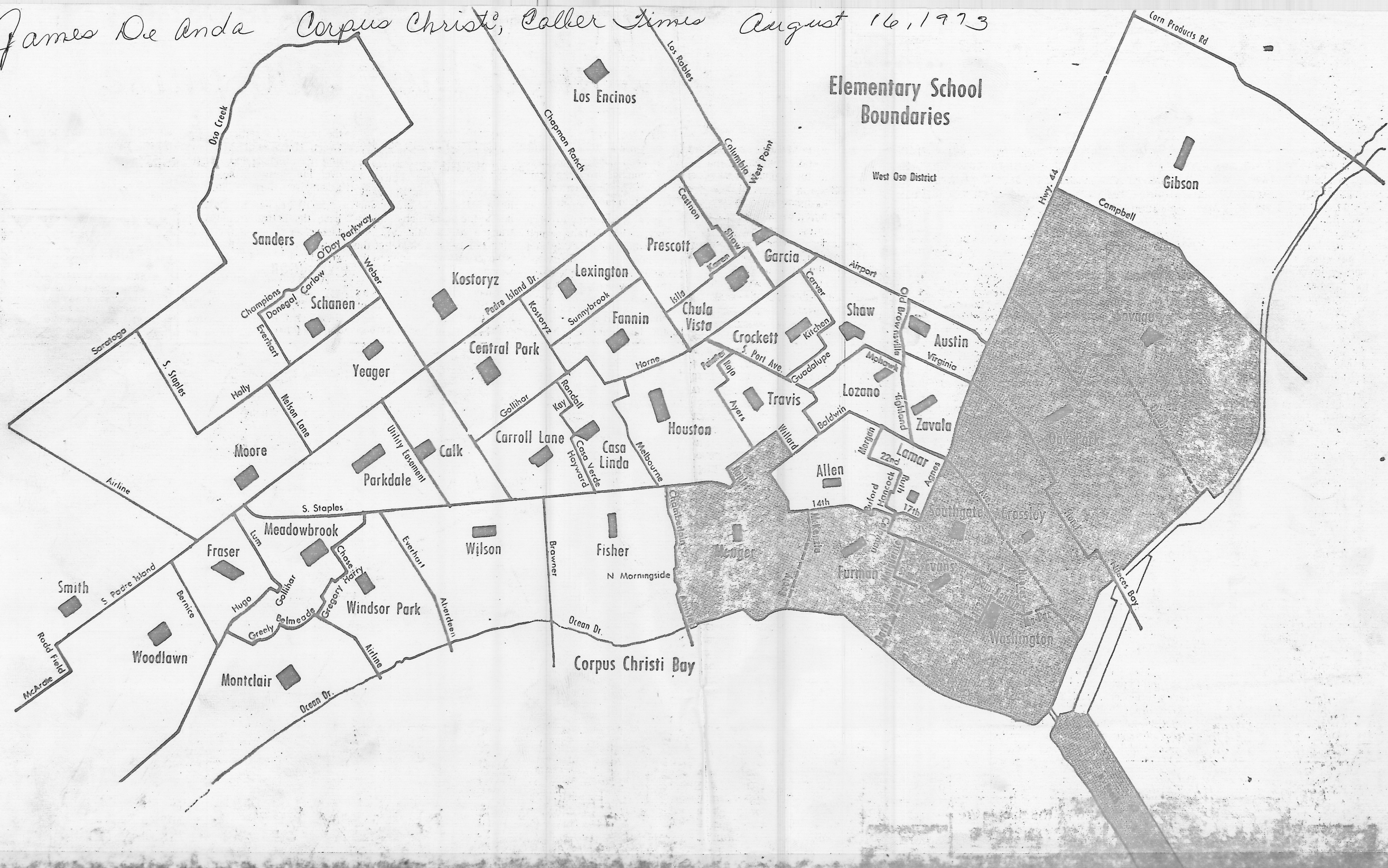




SHADED AREA SHOWS ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS AFFECTED THIS YEAR UNDER DESEGREGATION PLAN

School District list details zone changes in new plan

Here is a list, compiled by the Corpus Christi Independent School District, detailing the zone changes included in the desegregation plan.

The school board is expected to formally approve the changes today and they will go into effect when school opens this month.

The list shows which streets, by block, will be included in each school zone change. Where street name is followed by the designation "All" the entire street is included in the change.

The designation "odd" means that only odd-numbered houses are affected. "Even" indicates that the change affects only even-numbered houses.

For instance, under "Menger to Furman," the list shows that all even-numbered houses on the 500 through 1,000 blocks of Morgan will be taken out of the Menger zone and included in Furman's.

optimistic
on CAA funds*

An official of the Office of Economic Opportunity Metro Division in Dallas expressed optimism on additional funding for the Community Action Agency here last night.

Mrs. Leticia Acosta, the new community development specialist for the local agency, told the board that chances for funding in 1974 were good "but I have no guarantee that you will be funded."

She pointed out to the members of the executive committee of the board that the local agency was one of the agencies that received funding for 15 months. The funding covers operations through November.

Some of the 153 agencies covered in the metro region received funding for 8, 9 and 12 months.

She said she was optimistic on receiving an additional 12 months funding for next year.

Mrs. Acosta and Mrs. Betty Jean Witt, also of the metro division, will be in Corpus Christi until tomorrow. They will be talking to staff members and workers under CAA.

Mrs. Witt visited with VISTA workers yesterday and talked with officials of a program aimed at testing blacks for sickle cell anemia.

She said she would be talking with Dr. W. R. Metzger, director of the City-County Health Department here, about securing more personnel to help speed up the testing. She also suggested purchasing a mobil unit to provide testing to all segments of the community.

Workshop set here

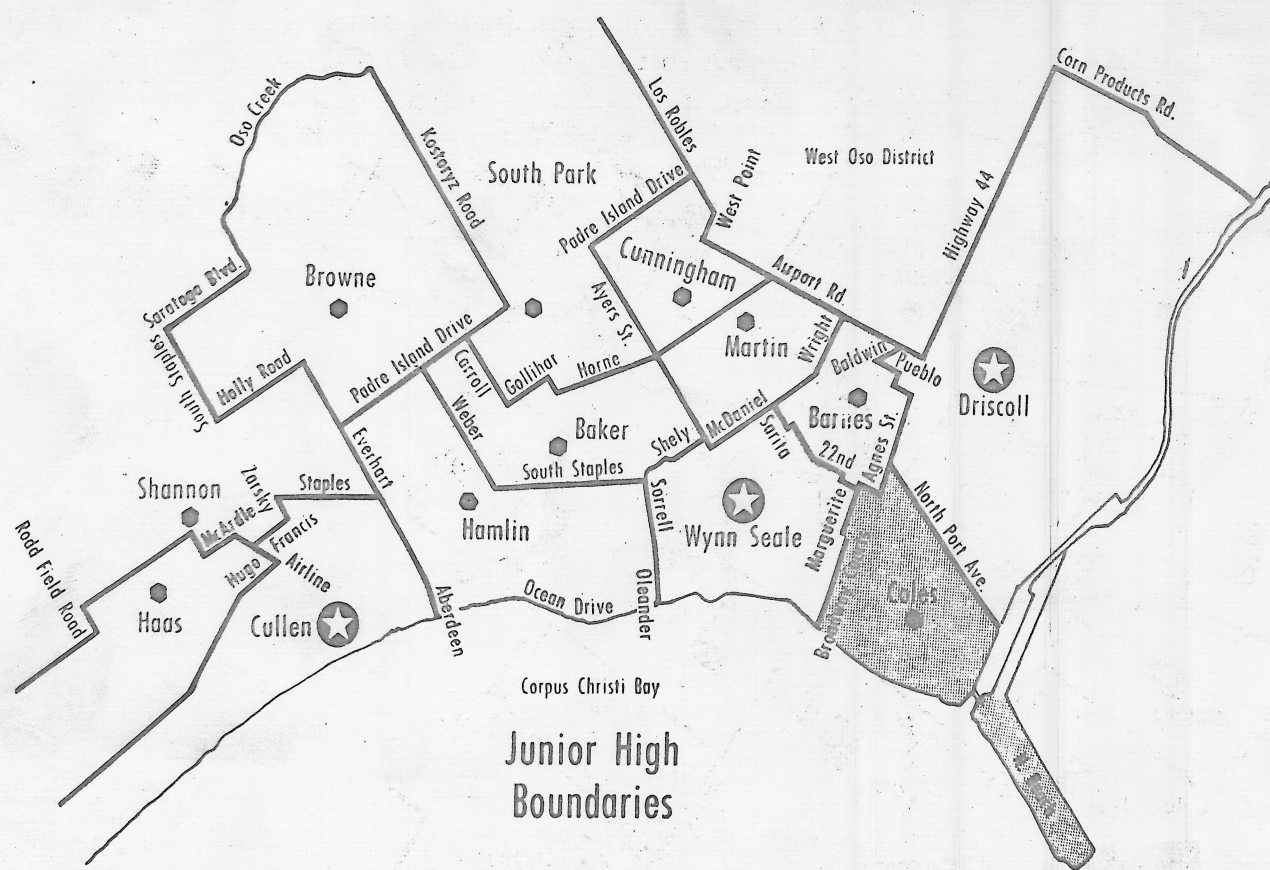
Administrators and officials of small cities in South Texas will meet here in a workshop today and tomorrow.
