TOEPLITZ EXAMINATION OF CHEST

Findings:

Thoracic cage, heart and mediastinum appear normal. There is a dense sharply defined mass about 2 cm in diameter lying behind the anterior arch of the second rib. There is some increased markings in the second and third interspace on this side. The remainder of the lung fields are clear.

Opinion:

A rounded mass of this size must always be considered a tumor until proved otherwise, however in the presence of the other rather minimal but definite degree of infiltration in this lobe I believe that there is a good possibility that this is a tuberculoma. Suggest that the patient be sent over here for fluoroscopic examination and lateral and oblique views for better localization of this lesion.

To Whom It May Concern:

I am enclosing a copy of a report of an X-Ray film made on the chest of Felipe Flores, by Dr. N. T. Gibson of Robstown, Texas, at the Robstown Hospital. The report is signed by my Partner, Dr. L.M. Garrett. The date of that examination, as you will note, is 3/25/54.

I have before me a film, marked Felipe Flores Arden, Marzo 25-55 and made by Dr. Raul Cota, whom I understand practices medicine in Reynosa, Mexico. On this film before me, I see a sharply defined mass, measuring 2 cm. in diameter, overlying the anterior end of the second rib on the right side. A comparison of the film made on March 25, 1955, with a report made by my partner, Dr. Garrett, on the film made by Dr. Gibson, on March 25, 1954, a year earlier, would indicate that there has been no change in the appearance of the lesion. It is, of course, impossible to differentiate between a tuberculoma (healed tuberculous nodule), and some other sort of benign tumor of the lung, but in that there has been no change in the appearance of the lesion over a period of one year., one can safely presume that there is no active pulmonary tuberculosis.
