One Columbian, Howard Davis, 502 Manor Dr., will be 1 among a group of University stu-8 dents visiting Washington, D. C. th next weekend to participate in re "Washington Action Project 1962" M sponsored by the Turn Toward Co Peace organization.

Turn Toward Peace, an organiha zation searching for alternatives to p present U. S. foreign policy, has as issued a nationwide appeal for 1,-000 students to demonstrate Feb. 16-17 in Washington to create a political atmosphere in which alternatives to the arms race can be seriously considered.

Other students planning to attend are Russ Goddard. Overland: James Hamilton, Marshall; and Froben Lozada, Donna, Tex.

The group will leave early Feb. 15 from St. Louis by chartered bus, and arrive in Washington Feb. 16. It will leave Washington Feb. 17, returning to the University Feb. 18.

On Feb. 16 students will picket the White House and other government buildings. Delegations will visit individual congressmen.

Picketing will continue on Feb. 17 as special delegations visit every Washington foreign embassy. That morning, the students will march to the White House for a demonstration. The final event will be a major rally late that afternoon with keynote speakers.

Goddard said, "Money has been collected from concerned individuals in town to pay part of the group's expenses for the Washington project."

Other groups co-operating with the Turn Toward Peace Project are The National Student Committee for a Sane Nuclear Policy, the National Student Peace Union, Students for a Democratic Society and the Fellowship of Reconciliation.
