RECEIVED NOTICE REDUCTION BEDS NAVAL BASE HERE MOVE IS UNWISE UNLESS WE GET VETERANS HOSPITAL IN SOUTH TEXAS. APPROXIMATELY 200,000 VETERANS SOUTH OF LINE BIG SPRING TEMPLE HOUSTON HAVE NO VETERANS HOSPITAL FACILITIES EXCEPT T.B. AT LEGION.

V.A. TEXAS HOSPITALS BESIDES ABOVE ARE AMARILLO MCKINNEY DALLAS WACO MARLIN. WHY ARE HOSPITALS BUILT UP NORTH AND NONE IN CENTRAL AND SOUTH TEXAS. POOREST AND SICKEST VETERANS ARE IN SOUTHERN CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS. REQUEST IMMEDIATE INVESTIGATION OF LACK VETERANS HOSPITAL FACILITIES.
