Dear Mr. Godfrey:

Were you aware of the Postal Service's Rehabilitation Program? The purpose is to restore injured former workers to duties within their physical limitations. The attending physician(s) must agree, and approve the job offered.

Some of the benefits are:

- 1. The number of years on compensation can be credited for retirement (OPM) purposes.
- 2. Establish a new "high three years" for computing retirement annuities.
- 3. Receive today's salary for the position held when injured.
- 4. Receive OWCP benefits for wage loss, if only working part-time.
- 5. Receive OWCP medical benefits for the work injury, even if you eventually retire.

6. Free basic life insurance, and additional life insurance at a smaller cost.

Most injured workers are not familiar with the regulations covering survivor benefits. Often, it is only after the death of the worker that the family discovers that compensation benefits will cease or be substantially reduced. It is then that the family depends on whatever retirement benefits, if any, the injured employee had.

If you feel qualified to return to part-time or full time limited duty work under the Postal Rehabiliation Program, please call the Injury Compensation Specialist at 886-2290. We will then contact your physician(s) and the Department of Labor Claims Examiner handling your case for further action.
