The Texas Medical Foundation (TMF) Physician Advisor (PA) has completed a review of the following case(s) referred to the Foundation by the National Heritage Insurance Company (NHIC). A determination has been rendered by the TMF PA as to the medical necessity of the admission and/or continued stay for each case (Attachment I).

Days of stay found not to be medically necessary by the TMF physician review will be reported to the Texas Department of Human Services (TDHS) for possible recoupment. Should the Utilization Review Committee (URC) wish to appeal any TMF decision, the hospital has a maximum of 15 days plus five days for mailing to submit medical appeal rationale to TMF. This total of 20 days is calculated from the date the hospital receives this correspondence. Please send appeal rationale to the attention of:
