Dear Dr. Garcia:

Your fellow community leaders have already asked that you receive a personal invitation to the first ever conference of its kind in South Texas and the Border Region, "The Future of a Region". I am sending you a second letter in order to update you on the progress of the conference planning.

On August 15, 16, and 17, your contemporaries will gather at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in downtown San Antonio to work on such major issues as water, education, tourism, human needs, infrastructure, agriculture, and future business development.

Nearly one hundred prominent executives and educators from the region have already trained as facilitators to aid the work sessions on each subject. Almost 40 state legislators will attend, along with Governor Mark White; current challenger William Clements has also been invited.

The event will be covered live by Rogers Cable, from San Antonio, and will be made available to stations across the region by satellite. Coverage will be similar to a national conference, as each community is interviewed about its current problems, potential solutions, and its bias for future action. Home viewership should be high throughout the region.

This conference is co-sponsored by several prominent organizations: the Border Economic Development Task Force; the UTSA Center for Economic Development, the Texas Municipal League; the Institute for Human Service; and the non-profit research center, the San Antonio Institute for American Studies -- with myself and SeaWorld land developer, Charles Martin Wender serving as chairmen.

I have enclosed a preliminary agenda for you to review. I hope you will be able to join us at the conference, an event all of us hope will promote a prosperous future for our region.
