
Dear Dr. Garcia:

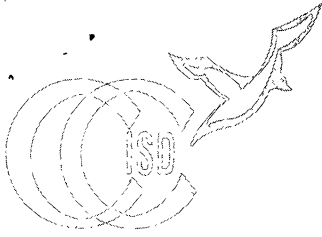
P.S.
