Dear Dr. Garcia:

Your letter of July 10, 1979, addressed to Mr. Jack McQueen, President of the Corpus Christi Board of Trustees, was handed to me by Mr. McQueen with the request that I respond for him. When your letter arrived, Mr. McQueen had been reassigned by Southwestern Bell Telephone Company from his position in Corpus Christi to the Texas headquarters in San Antonio. During the interim, he was on assignment in Kansas City, New York City and other cities, and had not been here to receive his mail. It was during this time, also, that he submitted a letter of resignation from the Board of Education.

During the interim, the matter which you raised in your letter has been resolved. Neither the Justice Department nor the Plaintiffs in our court case has filed an objection to the building of the elementary school in the Saratoga-Oso area; and as a part of our court order, an agreed judgment is being entered with the U. S. Federal District Court.

Dr. Garcia, I am sure it would be helpful to you and your attorney, Mr. G. Rudolph Garza, and possibly other members of the G.I. Forum if you desire, to visit with us. We would like to have the opportunity to share with you the information we had which caused us to recommend that the school be constructed at this time. Such a meeting could be arranged at your convenience.
