The ducation secretary tried to put to rest rumors of his impending departure from the Education Department during an interview Friday on The Learning Channel.

President Bush, he said, has been very supportive.

"Never once, never once has the president expressed dissatisfaction at the way I'm doing my job or the quality of work that is coming out of this department," said Cavazos.

Criticisms of Cavazos focus mainly on his unwillingness to argue for raising federal education spending and to use his office as a "bully pulpit," as did his flamboyant predecessor, William Bennett.

Since his first day in office, Cavazos' professorial style, which he said evolved through many years of increasing achievement and responsibilities as dean of a medical school and president of Texas Tech University, has been compared with that of Bennett.


