





# ROBERT BENTON


Before he became a screenwriter and director, Robert Benton, BFA '53, of New York, was art director for *Esquire* magazine and served in the Army during the Korean War.

He gained fame on the UT campus and built up his art portfolio as a cartoonist for the *Texas Ranger*. He was also an associate editor of the magazine.

While he was at *Esquire*, he collaborated with David Newman on the screenplay for *Bonnie and Clyde*, a successful first effort for both of them. Benton says his best work has been about real people. Two of his bestaccepted movies are *Kramer vs. Kramer* and *Places in the Heart*, which was set in Waxahachie, where he grew up.

Benton also wrote and directed: The Late Show, Bad Company, Still of the Night, and Nadine. For the stage he wrote It's a Bird . . . It's a Plane . . . It's Superman! and a segment for Oh, Calcutta. He has also written children's books.

Benton's wife Sally, a native of Kansas City, and their son John are artists. John recently graduated from the Art Institute of Chicago.




# GEORGE E. CHRISTIAN

Among the many well-known former students of The University of Texas' Department of Journalism, George Christian, a political consultant in Austin, stands near the top.

During his college days in the '40s and '50s, he wrote for the *Texas Ranger* and covered sports for the *Daily Texan*. He was later sports editor for the *Temple Telegram* before returning to Austin to cover the state government for International News Service. He became press secretary and top aide to Governor Price Daniel and press secretary for Governor John Connally before moving to Washington to become President Lyndon Johnson's press secretary.

He has devoted a great deal of time to The University of Texas, The Ex-Students' Association, the Texas Historical Commission, and All Saints' Episcopal Church. He is a former president of UT's Communication Foundation Advisory Council and a member of the McDonald Observatory Board of Visitors; he is an officer of the Lyndon Baines Johnson Foundation, is on NASA's Public Affairs Task Force and is a member of the board of Scott & White Memorial Hospital and the advisory council of the College of Medicine of Texas A&M University. He has chaired the Headliners Foundation.

He and his wife Jo Anne, a UT law graduate, have six children and three grandchildren.



# HÉCTOR P. GARCÍA

A much decorated man, Dr. Héctor García, BA '36, MD '40, Corpus Christi, won the Bronze Star for heroic service in World War II and the Presidential Medal of Freedom, awarded by President Reagan, for extraordinary service as a civilian. The main post office and a city park in Corpus Christi are named for him.

He has received hundreds of plaques and citations as founder of The American G.I. Forum. The Forum, now more than 40 years old, looks back on numerous successes in its battle for benefits, as well as social and political equality, for Mexican-American veterans and their families.

He has served on the Democratic National Committee and on the National Advisory Council on Economic Opportunity, and he has been a delegate to the United Nations and a member of the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights. He represented the United States with Vice President Hubert Humphrey at the signing of a treaty in Mexico and represented President Lyndon Johnson in 1964 at the inauguration of the president of Venezuela.

García was born in Mexico, but he came to the Texas Valley with his mother and father in 1917 when he was 3 years old. He still practices medicine. He and his wife Wanda have three daughters.



# REYNALDO G. GARZA


A native of Brownsville, Judge Reynaldo Garza, BA '39, LLB '39, has served on the school board, the city commission, and the chamber of commerce. He was director of the Brownsville United Fund, president of the Rotary Club and the Rio Grande Council of the Boy Scouts, and was treasurer of the Cameron County Child Welfare Board. His son Ignacio Garza is Brownsville's mayor.

Judge Garza has held a statewide office in the Knights of Columbus and appointments in the field of education from Governors Daniel, Connally, and White.

Under a 1979 appointment from President Jimmy Carter, he is a senior judge of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit. His first presidential appointment came in 1961 when President John F. Kennedy named him to the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Texas. He became chief justice of the Southern District in 1974.

After graduating from UT Law School, he was in private practice in Brownsville. He served in the Army Air Corps during World War II as an aerial gunner and instructor. After the war, he became a partner in the law firm of Sharpe, Cunningham and Garza.

Garza and his wife Bertha have three sons, two daughters, and nine grandchildren.



### JAMES R. MOFFETT

With his elevation to CEO and chairman of the board after the merger of McMoRan Oil and Gas Company and Freeport Minerals, Jim Bob Moffett, BS '61, New Orleans, became one of the top executives in the country.

Moffett's commitments to UT include the Development Board, the Chancellor's Council, life membership in the President's Associates, the Dad's Association, the executive council of the The Ex-Student's Association, and the advisory council of the Longhorn Foundation. He has served on the Geology Foundation Advisory Council. He established a professorship and scholarship fund in geology and Freeport-McMoRan recently gave a million dollars for geological research.

He has received many honors in his home city, where he organized the New Orleans Business Council and chaired the New Orleans Chamber of Commerce. A recent honor was the Great American Traditions Award presented to him by the B'nai B'rith Foundation of the United States. The New Orleans Texas Exes are establishing an endowed scholarship in his honor.

Moffett and his wife Louise have a daughter, Crystal, a UT graduate, and a son, Bubba, a geology major and a football player at UT.



## EDITH JONES O'DONNELL

Since Edith O'Donnell, BA '48, Dallas, graduated from the University of Texas, she has served on three school boards—the Episcopal School of Dallas, the Lamplighter School, and Hockaday School, which she now serves as an honorary trustee. She has also been on the advisory board for the Meadows School of the Arts.

She was one of two founders of the Young Audiences of Greater Dallas, which is a national program that introduces the performing arts to children, from kindergarten through middle school.

As an appointee of Governor Bill Clements, Edith served a six-year term on the Texas Commission on the Arts and helped organize the Friends of the Governor's Mansion. She also served on the boards of the Children's Development Center and the Children's Medical Center of Dallas and the Children's Bureau of Hope Cottage.

She helped found the O'Donnell Foundation, which has made large grants to engineering and science education at The University of Texas. A recent gift was designated for the UT College of Fine Arts.

Edith and her husband Peter, who is president of the O'Donnell Foundation and holds the Santa Rita Award from the UT System, have three daughters and two grandchildren.
