Dear Mr. Young:

This is in reply to your inquiry of 24 July 1968 in the interest of Private E-1 Cornelio Lugo, US 54 720 032, a member of Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 2d Battalion, 21st Artillery, Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, APO San Francisco 96557.

Private Lugo is presently assigned and performing duty with the organization indicated in paragraph 1, above. He is not in confinement at the present time. Mail may be addressed to him at that address.

On 26 July 1968, Private Lugo was arraigned and tried before a special court-martial and convicted for: (1) Violation of Article 86, Uniform Code of Military Justice, in that he was absent without leave from his unit from 1800 hours, 21 June 1968 through 1400 hours, 22 June 1968, and that he failed to report to his prescribed place of duty at 0600 hours, 1 July 1968 for reveille formation, and at 1330 hours, 1 July 1968 for roll call. (2) Violation of Article 113, in that he was found sleeping at his post while on duty on 9 June 1968. He was sentenced by the court to confinement at hard labor for six months, forfeiture of \$46.00 per month for six months, and reduction to the lowest enlisted grade.

Action taken by the special court-martial convening authority reduced the confinement at hard labor from six months to four months, and suspended the four-month confinement at hard labor until 23 November 1968. At that time, unless the suspension is sooner vacated, the suspended portion shall be remitted without further action.
