

New Electronic Resources

President Killebrew and Provost Babbili have made funds available to the library to purchase the entire backfile of Web of Science. These backfiles provide continuous citation coverage from 1900 for Science Citation Index; from 1956 for the Social Science Citation Index; and from 1975 for the Arts & Humanities Citation Index. These citation indexes are searchable singly or collectively. [Citation indexes, along with general search capabilities allow users to connect an article with papers which cited that article. It can also connect with citations of the paper going forward.] Web of Science is also linked to the rest of the library's full text databases, so that citations will link to full text articles that are available to TAMUCC users.

Other electronic resources (or databases) that we've recently added include Educational Administration Abstracts and Public Administration Abstracts. Also new is the Medical Video & Animation Collection. The Sage Journals Online from Sage Publishing will provide full text for a great many journals in Business, Medicine, Education, the Social Sciences and Humanities. We now have access to Accounting Research Manager from CCH and Westlaw Campus Research is available thanks to the College of Business and the Harte Research Institute.




Two library staff members proudly announce the arrival of new grandchildren:

Distributed Learning Librarian Denise Landry-Hyde received the second annual Excellence in Librarianship Award for 2007-2008 from the university's Faculty Senate. The university bestows this honor to professional librarians who have demonstrated excellence in the practice of librarianship for the library, the university and the profession as a whole. Provost Anantha Babbili presented Mrs. Landry-Hyde with the award during the Islander Awards Celebration on April 4, 2008.

Landry-Hyde has served the Mary and Jeff Bell Library in several capacities since 1993, including Coordinator of Reference Services, Information Literacy Coordinator and Distributed Learning Librarian. She is known among her colleagues for her genuine interest in teaching and for de-



veloping innovative methods of providing information literacy instruction to students in online classes. Faculty members and students alike commend her for her dedication to the profession of librarianship and for her ability to assist others in navigating the complex world of research resources.

Mrs. Landry-Hyde has served on numerous library and university committees during her tenure at the Mary and Jeff Bell Library. Special Collections & Archives: Audrey L. Flores

Audrey Flores, who served as a student worker and as a graduate assistant in Special Collections & Archives, is an example of someone who both contributed to and benefited from her work in the department. With this issue of *Infowave*, we celebrate Audrey's recent graduation with her M.A. in History and her advancement in archival management.

A native of Corpus Christi, Audrey Louise Flores graduated from W.B. Ray High School in 1993. She received an Associate of Arts degree in history from Del Mar College in 1996. She then commenced her studies at A&M-Corpus Christi majoring in history. After graduating in 1998, she worked for a time to save money to continue her education.

Audrey began taking graduate courses at A&M-Corpus Christi in 2001. As she progressed she was drawn to public history, in particular archival management. She was first introduced to Special Collections & Archives in the History 4385 capstone class with Professor Pat Carroll. In 2004, she took my Applied History course and simultaneously served as my graduate assistant for that class where her performance was outstanding. She subsequently became a student worker in the department.

To increase her skills, Audrey also worked as a tour guide at the Corpus Christi Museum of Science and History and secured part time employment at the local history room of the Corpus Christi Public Library. Because of her interest in weather as a force in history, she volunteered at the local National Oceanic Atmospheric Association Weather Forecast Office at the Corpus Christi International Airport.

When Special Collections & Archives received its first regular graduate assistantship in 2006, Audrey was chosen for that position. During her time here she worked on the archival arrangement and preservation of the Kay McCracken Papers, the E.E. and Jovita Gonzales Mireles Papers, and the Gold Photography Collection. She also ar-

ranged and digitized historic photographs in various collections. Because of Audrey's excellent work, several hundred images were placed on the department's homepage for distance access.

In 2007, Audrey received her M.A. in History after completing her thesis entitled "Environmental History on the Texas Gulf Coast: The Abandonment of the Port Town of Indianola" under Professor David Blanke. She utilized research materials from many sources, including Special Collections & Archives. Her topic, dealing with history and weather, is timely and important.

Since graduating, Audrey became employed at Texas State University in San Marcos as a Library Assistant for the University Archives Department. She plans to enroll in TSU's doctoral program in Environmental Geography, thus building on her work at A&M-Corpus Christi.

Audrey Flores is a worthy representative of the education provided by Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi. She credits much of her development to Special Collections & Archives and to the history program. We look forward to Audrey's continued success.
