

Use of transfer plan urged

to be bussed anyway they should ask for a transfer to any of the schools where they will be in a minority."

The head of the local chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People last night urged parents of black students affected by the Corpus Christi school district's latest desegregation plan to use the latest transfer rule.

Preston Smith, president of the NAACP, told members during a regular meeting that since students from the Coles Junior High School would have

the racial-ethnic transfer rule, a black student may transfer from a school where blacks make up more than 5.5 per cent to a school where they are less than 5.5 per cent.

Smith also complained that despite the proposed changes "the planacle of segregation has not been touched. The school board is not getting into the meat of the desegregation suit.

"Only the black schools are

being eradicated. The basic thing that brought the spit remains unchanged," Smith said.

Smith also discussed proposed projects aimed at the NAACP's latest recruiting drive. They also discussed several money-making projects to help support scholarships and to send delegates to the state NAACP convention in Lubbock later this year.
