Dear Mr. Clark: During my conference with you the latter part of December, you requested a copy of the pleadings in the Odem School Case, styled Diego Chapa, a minor, et al vs. Odem Independent School District (C. A. No. 66-C-92). forward herewith copies of the following instruments: 1. Complainants' Original Complaint Defendants' Original Answer 2. Complainants' Motion for Summary Judgment 3. 4. Defendants' Motion for Summary Judgment 5. Complainants' Memorandum Brief Order of the Court dated July 28, 1967 You will note that the order entered in the case is not a final order. The complainants are challenging the legality of the placement and testing procedures adopted by the district after this lawsuit was filed. To summarize, the complainants contend that segregation of Mexican-American children within the school building, based upon their limited ability to speak and understand English is illegal because 1.) Separating these children from English speaking children retards their ability to speak English rather than enhance it, and 2.) The district has failed to give any special remedial instructions to correct the so-called defects once the children are segregated. The end result of the system is that it accomplishes nothing other than segregation of Mexican-American children from Anglo children.

Copies of the depositions of the school superintendent and the school principals involved are being forwarded to you under separate cover. The court has indicated that this matter will be set for final hearing in March.

I enjoyed our meeting very much and I am grateful to you for the time you gave me, Dr. Garcia and Commissioner Ximenes. Although I recognize the problems involved, I feel that the active participation of your office in these cases will bring about an early solution to the segregation

A review of the statistical information pertaining to the Odem Schools and the failure of the Odem system is a fair and typical example of the type of education our state

is giving Mexican-American children. Help us.
