Recently I had lunch with a friend who has assumed corporate responsibility for implementing in industry Federal programs for training unemployables and upgrading the underemployed.

When I explained our situation in Corpus he indicated that, if statistical data confirms the situation, the programs could be implemented in all Federally financed, regulated and/or subsidized industry in Corpus.

His experience has been largely confined to the Negro problem; but, as he says, the funds are appropriated and must be spent or lost and if the problems of the Mexican American are significant then they should get their share.

In thinking of his statements, I have become much concerned about our problems and the relative future position of our children. I think a deeper look into the possibilities of which he spoke would be of value to us and if you could have one of your girls collate the needed data I can approach him on a program oriented basis.
