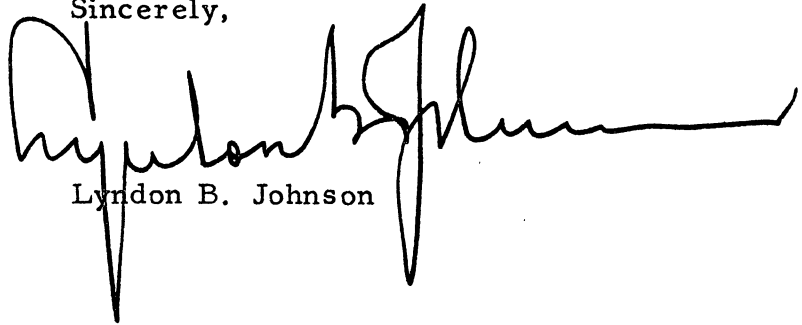
Dear Dr. Garcia:
