You don't know how good it makes a man feel when he arrives at the office and finds a letter such as yours on the top of his stack of mail to be answered.

I wish it were possible for me to write all 400 of those delegates who endorsed your Resolution. I am not only grateful for the kind words said about me by the men mentioned in your letter, but I am grateful to all.

I note in your letter that a lot of lady delegates and junior delegates took the floor in support of your Resolution. If it's not too much trouble, I would like for you to furnish me the names and addresses of those who spoke for the Resolution, so I can write them personally.

In regard to the two or three members from San Antonio that opposed me, I would like to say this: my father told me when I was just a youngster that a man's judgement is no better than his information. So I assume that they were not informed, and I hold no malice against any of them. People can have opposite views and still remain good friends. I am sure at times you do not approve 100% of everything I do. But on the other hand when we might be in disagreement, you are the type of man who will understand there might be two sides to the question.

I have enjoyed my many enlightening talks with you. It has been a great pleasure to work with you for what we think is best for our state and nation, and we will continue to do that. My doctors say I have completely recovered from my heart attack, but in case they should be wrong, the letter I received from you makes it feel much better.
