Enclosed is a copy of my bill, Senate Bill 2660, and a copy of the CONGRESSIONAL RECORD of July 18, 1969. On page \$8257 begin the remarks I made on the floor of the Senate in introducing Senate Bill 2660, entitled the Migrant Worker Health Amendments of 1969, a bill that would authorize the preservation and extension of the Public Health Service Act for migrant health services.

When the Migrant Health Act was first passed into law in 1962, organized systems to extend community health services to migrants were extremely rare. Now, the Public Health Service informs me that 118 single and multi-county projects assisted by migrant health grants serve migrants in 317 counties in nearly 36 states and Puerto Rico, involving 170 hospitals and nearly 1,000 physicians. Of the estimated 300,000 migrants living in project areas for at least a brief period of time during 1968, 110,000 received medical care and 3,400 were hospitalized.

As I said in the Senate, the work is well begun. However, the potential of the program is far from being reached at the present time. The Migrant Worker Health Amendments of 1969 which I introduced into the Senate are intended to preserve, greatly expand and improve this essential program. I will work diligently for its passage during this session of Congress.
