Dear Mr. Idar:

Thanks for your letter about the Party Registration Bill and the Texas Migrant Labor Council.

I have not yet seen Kika's bill on party registration; I simply said at the meeting that I would oppose a bill forcing a person to declare his allegiance to either party six months ahead of an election. This would certainly be unfair to the voter, as he is not even sure at that time who the candidates will be for either party.

I agree with you, that it is not fair for members of one party to take part in conventions and affairs of the other party. At any rate, I will go over Kika's Bill carefully with him to see if we can work out something that will be fair.

As you know, I helped sponsor the Texas Migrant Labor Council last session. I am very much in favor of an appropriation being granted to this Agency, as the migrant labor situation is a real problem in the Valley.
