Dear Doctor:

I have intended writing you for some time about conditions here at Hilltop, and Mrs. Blades' treatment, (or "lack" of treatment), of the patients, but thought I would be able to get to town and see you before this.

I foolishly let Mrs. Blades have an idea of why I wanted to go though, and now she is seeing to it that I don't.

Father Kolvenbach was here to say Mass for us this morning, and showed me a letter he received from Mrs. H. E. Butte giving him a report on her "Investigation", and most probably Father has brought it

to you to read.

So he went into great detail to explain away Mrs Blades operating on Eugene Leal's fistula with a sterilized razor blade, and how she had first phoned Dr. Brown for permission.

Also that he had been on the porch in great pain and that she had to assist him to his room.

The truth of the matter is that all of us were in bed and when she came in Eugene's room to see if he or the other two patients in the room needed anything, he told her he was sick with the Hemmichoids - they had told him that was what it was at Julia's place, before he was transferred here - and when Mrs Blades examined it and saw it was

are betting themselves by not telling what they know of Conditions here, but most of them are afraid to talk to anyone because they have seen how tough Mrs. Blad's has made it for those who have before.

I have been accepted at Mission and will leave some time soon I suppose, but I would appreciate hearing from you before I do, and if there is anything I can do to help these patients who have to stay here, please let me know.

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A rather boast of Mrs. Smith's was that they gave everyone Streptomycin at no cost, and no other County or the State San would do it. I told Mrs. Blades some time ago that three different Doctors at the State San told me it would do me no good, and forty two days of it here didn't. Everything I have ever read on Streptomycin was against the promiscuous use of it, and yet Dr. Brown recommended it for every patient here. How many of us will need it later, and won't be able to - or if we do take it, won't get any good out of it, because of having it now, is another question!

Some of the Latin American patients here (a few) feel they

I could have coasted along  
and never said a word and gotten  
by fine here, but I have too much  
Irish in me to let her treat these  
patients like this, feed us rotten  
food as she did in January &  
February when she had sold the  
country two bulls and a hog and  
we saw roast pork twice, roast  
beef once, pork chops once, tho  
we did have chicken nearly every  
Sunday, and the rest of the time  
lived off of weiners, sausage,  
and soup (every day for a week one  
time) and this ground meat they  
use to make tamales.

he's getting in pretty bad shape, but knows there's no use telling her again, as she would only get angry.

A Miss Lupe Perez is another example. She has been a bed patient for about four months now, and has been the best patient here in my ~~attent~~ (excuse?) opinion, but wasn't feeling well about a week ago and told Mrs Dean the nurse she had pleurisy pains, and Mrs Dean laughed, and said "That's too bad", and kept going. She also asked her for aspirin several times and received an "I'll think about it", but no aspirin. Two or three days ago she had  $100^{\circ}$  temperature and a sore

throat and told Mrs. Black  
who said she would bring her  
something but hasn't done it  
yet. Lupe also gets nauseated  
on this ovaltine Mrs. B., tries  
to force on us every night, but  
after not drinking it for some  
time Mrs. B. insisted on her trying  
it again, and after several  
nights she vomited it all up  
again.

I could go on like this  
for hours doctor, and would if  
I could see someone besides  
Mrs. Butt, who would believe  
me, but I won't take any more  
of your time with it now.

I have seen three of us  
Anglo Americans, and eighteen  
Latin Americans, and I've  
seen nearly every one of the

a fistula that was in bad shape and not draining she went and got a face mask, operating robe and rubber gloves and came back and gave him a shot of penicillin and then borrowed a razor blade from Cardona - one of the other patients in the room - and proceeded to cut on the fistula without leaving the room to sterilize the blade, call Dr. Brown, or anything else. She evidently saw she couldn't finish it, or became afraid, for she quit and next morning brought him to Memorial Hospital, where he should have been taken that night if the emergency was so great. Luckily, though no credit is due her, infection didn't

set in, and he is getting along  
all right ever since. Eugene  
Leal, Cardona & Martinez the  
three patients in the room  
can verify the truth of this.

It has happened a few months  
ago of course, but Mrs. Blades  
is ignoring the patients she does -  
it like - all Latin Americans, of  
course - just as she did before  
and will continue to do so just  
as long as Dr. Brown backs up  
her lies as he's doing now.

Cardona has a swelling  
and quite a bit of pain in his  
chest, and tho he told her of it  
twice - the last time on May 10<sup>th</sup>  
when she said she would check  
on it the next day - she has not  
done a thing about it since, and  
Cardona is so blue and disgusted
