This will be a difficult meeting for them since there are still many honest differences of opinion among them about the nature and degree of federal power vs. island power. The leaders all then go to London on May 31 to confer with the British on a firm date for West Indian independence.

We hear that Dr. Mahabir is going to England soon to take some refresher courses in medicine. As you know, he has been unhappy politically in recent months in Trinidad and I expect he will welcome the change in climate for the time being.
