Dear Hector:

In reply to my letter to Dr. Sanchez, you fail to indicate whether or not you are in a position to help me in the event that I do decide to return to Austin. My letter to Dr. Sanchez pretty well lays out what my economic picture is. If you are able to help, I would like to know to what extent and if you are able to do so at the time I make the move.

As for my feeling bitter, it may be that a large part of the reason is the treatment I got at the hands of Judge Yarborough when he kept me waiting an hour and a half, told me to come back later, and when I did return, he had left without leaving word with his secretary. Perhaps I did try to enlist support for Hart, but if that was my sin, then I suppose what I did in the 1952 and 1954 campaigns, plus the fact that in 1954 and 1956 while he was jockeying for position I was very instrumental in trying to see that the Latins stuck with him. Had we not done so, very possibly labor and other groups might have abandoned him—and he knows it. Furthermore, I've seen him far businer during campaigns than the day I was there—and I have seen the time when he would drop everything and run over to see me instead of my seeking him.

I cannot help but reflect that had it been you who called on him, he would not have kept YUU sitting around for an hour and a half. The Judge-Sen ator knows well that He is now well known among la raza, that I do not have access to Forum files, etc., and that I am not in a position to help him as I was in Austin. Also, I must have hit at the wrong time. He must have thought I was trying to line up a position on his Washington staff.

The worst mistake I ever made was having tried to get on his staff a year ago. My relationship with him was fine from 1952 to that time. Thereafter, after I tried to help myself even in such a small way for what I would have got would have been only enough—with the Forum salary—to keep my family, everything has gone hawwire.

I realize that you probably do not have all the things you would like to have. A two-bedroom home is not large enough for a family of six. I agree. I would also like to see you have your own building. But you certainly do not want to compare my own position to yours. Frankly, since I have been in Laredo I have had to rely on my mother and sisters to foot part of my family's grocery bill.
