#### **RASSA—A Citizens' Lobby For the Spanish Speaking**

**RASSA was created out of a need.** For years national legislation, political issues, and major programmatic decisions have been determined largely in ignorance of the unique needs of the country's 14 million Spanish surnamed citizens.

In recent times, there has been a nationwide development of new leaders and organizations dedicated to serving the Spanish speaking. This effort, however, has been primarily local and regional in scope, or has been addressed to non-political goals. Community efforts organized as tax exempt associations are prohibited from engaging in political activity.

# There was no sustained effort to influence legislation and federal policy at the nation's Capital.

Recognizing this, the Raza Association of Spanish surnamed Americans was formed —to fill this gap with a sophisticated, action-oriented organization dedicated to serving the legislative and political interests of the nation's Spanish speaking, Spanish surnamed population.

Today, RASSA stands alone as the first permanent national, non-partisan Spanish speaking citizens' lobby.

# **RASSA Lobbys For Interests of Spanish Speaking**

Many groups support powerful lobbies which seek to influence national legislation and federal policy to their benefit. Until now the Spanish speaking have never had the benefit of daily representation at the nation's capitol, free of partisan political interest, which would seek to sensitize Congressmen and national officials to their particular needs.

**RASSA fills this gap** by developing working relations with Congressmen and important congressional committees thereby influencing directly the content of pending legislation and directly assisting the development of important legislation to help the Spanish speaking.

**RASSA fills this gap** by "watchdogging" federal agencies and national programs to assure significant input in behalf of the Spanish speaking, input which too often falls by the wayside due to lack of persistent daily activity.

Through painstaking research and community survey from the local to the national levels, RASSA develops its priorities and works them into a systematic pattern of action.

# **RASSA Informs the Community**

Through research papers, publications, and response to specific requests RASSA informs its membership of critical policies and legislation pending before national officials. More, RASSA assists the community in affecting pending matters by providing timely information on who to contact and the scheduling of congressional hearings. On request, RASSA also conducts research and assists members of the community in preparing testimony and developing strategy.

As a citizens' lobby, supported by the community, RASSA's only commitment is and will be to the best interests of Spanish-speaking people.

# **RASSA Needs You**

RASSA, as a citizens' lobby for the Spanish speaking, must be a political counterweight, growing in numbers, resources, and sophistication. # How To Belong

**Sustaining** membership is open to any Spanish surnamed/Spanish speaking person who is a citizen of the United States. Every sustaining member shall have full voting rights and shall be eligible for membership on the Board of Trustees. Dues for a sustaining membership are \$100 annually.

**Subscription** memberships are extended at large to any person who subscribes to RASSA LOBBYIST, the official publication of RASSA. Dues for subscription membership are \$50 annually.
