

The Periodicals staff consists of one librarian, one library assistant, and eight student workers. The department relies heavily upon these student employees, who are responsible for everything from collection maintenance to customer service.



# Special Collections & Archives: Publication of Ignacio Garcia, <u>Viva Kennedy</u>

The recent appearance of Ignacio Garcia, <u>Viva Kennedy: Mexican Americans In Search of Camelot</u> (College Station: Texas A&M University Press, 2000) represents a significant contribution to historical literature and is another milestone in the use of materials held by Special Collections & Archives. The author draws heavily from the Dr. Hector P. Garcia Papers in his examination of one of the most important phenomena in Mexican American political development.


A former A&M University-Corpus Christi history faculty member, Ignacio Garcia is currently professor of history at Brigham Young University. His book is an account of the mass movement among Mexican Americans during and immediately following the 1960 presidential campaign of Senator John F. Kennedy. Professor Garcia's volume is destined to receive national acclaim.

Dr. Hector P. Garcia was one of the national coordinators of the Viva Kennedy Clubs and was deeply involved in the politics resulting from the 1960 campaign. His papers in Special Collections & Archives are the major holding of primary documents in the United States on that political movement. Although Professor Garcia was keenly interested in the subject, he became convinced that enough material existed to write a book on the topic after he had been introduced to Dr. Hector's papers.

Professor Garcia praises the Garcia Papers and especially the assistance provided by Grace Charles, Special Collections staff member and processor of the Garcia Papers. Through Grace's personal attention, Special Collections was able to extend the highest quality of service to Professor Garcia during his research of this excellent book.

In addition, the publication of Viva Kennedy helps to real-

ize Dr. Hector's dream that his papers be used for scholarship. Their role in <u>Viva Kennedy</u> continues to demonstrate the wisdom of Dr. Hector's decision to donate his papers to A&M University-Corpus Christi, where they receive the care they so fully deserve.
