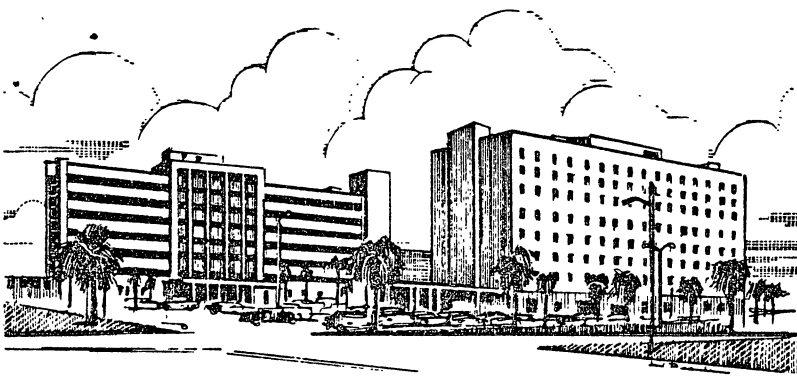

commissioners. And the city council named its first city manager. Now that we have the city manager the city of Corpus Christi is running the risk of declaring bankruptcy.

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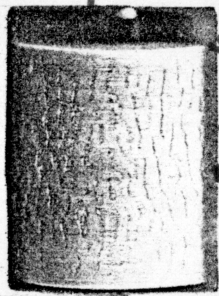
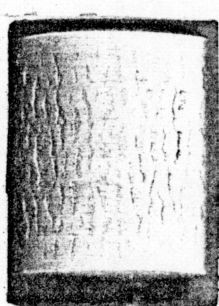
