I WOULD LIKE TO POINT OUT THAT ALTHOUGH | DO APPROVE OF YOUR RECOMMENDATIONS, IT WILL STILL NOT DO ANY GOOD IF OUR LOCAL PEOPLE DO NOT HAVE THE GUARANTEES OR IMPROVING CONDITIONS. I KNOW THAT YOUR INTENTIONS ARE GOOD, BUT I CERTAINLY THINK THAT THE BEST THING TO DO IS TO ELIMINATE THE BRACERO PROGRAM COMPLETELY AND GIVE OUR PEOPLE A CHANCE TO ASK FOR HIGHER WAGES.

I SINCERELY BELIEVE THAT IF THE BRACEROS GET OUT OF THE COUNTRY, OUR PEOPLE WILL GET THIS GUARANTEES AND PERHAPS MORE. HOWEVER, PLEASE DO NOT TAKE THIS PERSONALLY, I JUST QUESTION THE WISDOM OF THE AD-MINISTRATION'S RECOMMENDATION. CERTAINLY, THE MOST YOU SHOULD GIVE IS A GINE YEAR EXTENSION. A TWO YEAR EXTENSION IS TOO DANGEROUS.
