Dear Dr. Garcia,

Thank you for your letter of 10 June 1985 regarding the problem of Mr. Daniel J. Ramirez, Jr. I am aware of the allegation and have received a package of documents from Mr. Ramirez.

I have been thoroughly briefed on the current status of his case. The formal complaint has been accepted by the activity and an investigator requested from the the appropriate Navy Civilian Personnel Command (NCPC) Region, in this case NCPC South West Region in San Diego, CA. The personnel at NAS Chase Field have processed the complaint in accordance with Navy procedure and in a timely manner.

An investigator has been assigned and is expected to start the investigation 24 June 1985. The investigation will include a thorough review of the circumstances under which the alleged discrimination occurred. He will prepare a report with recommended findings based on facts and Title VII Case Law for review by the Commanding Officer and Mr. Ramirez.

Be assured, Dr. Hector, that Mr. Ramirez has been, and will continue to be afforded all his rights which includes the right to a representative at every stage of the process.

I fully understand your strong interest in this case and that of the American GI Forum. I am firmly committed to fair and equal treatment of all employees of the Naval Air Training Command and will keep you advised of progress in this case.
