

We will gather for a reunion reception and dinner beginning at 6:30 p.m., Friday, March 16, 1990, in the Topgallant Ballroom on the second floor of the Wentletrap Restaurant. There will be an open bar preceding a gourmet dinner. We were always satisfied with the very best. (No health foods. At our age we need all the preservatives we can get.) The cost for this magnificent dinner and reception will be a modest \$50 each which will provide, also, a book of memorabilia to be sent to you later.
