Door Mr. Boosevelt:

I am ours that what transpired at the Albuquerque sessions of the conference called by EEOG is basen to you. I am deeply disappointed, but I must agree with the desisten of the Munican-American delegations. I attach a copy of their sensions.

Mexican-Americans constitute the second largest "minerity group" in the United States. I have repeatedly pointed to the meglect to which it has been treated -- in writings, in public addresses, in conferences with governmental agencies, etc., ever some 43 years of professional life. To what offset? Your Commission seems to be concerned only with the Magro. As an officer of the old Julius Recented Fund I because such involved in the "Magro problem," and we still are not doing enough to do justice to that problem. But, we have done mothing for some him million Americans of Maxican descent -- in education, in employment opportunity, or in any other major field of governmental concern. Just by way of illustration; the 1960 U. S. Oznawa of Population shows that Spanish-surmane persons, 17 years old or older in Temps, have 4.7 years of schooling. The Magro has 3.1:

The bitterness of my people is understandable, not only because of such statistical disparities but also for other reasons. We were here, as Indians, from time immemorial. As Duropeans, we were here long before Jamestown and Plymouth Rock. And, remamber, we did not sek the United States to some here! We were a subject people, just as were the Fuerto Ricans and the Filipinos. Ware we given the same consideration? I am glad and proved to be a U.S. American, but I am not important of history, of justice.

Mr. Roosevelt, I'll make bold to suggest a reconsideration of the structure and policy of EEOC. Please be assured of my cooperation.
