He said after the group had adopted Maloney's recommendation, that he would contact regional Office of Economic Opportunity officials in Austin, Tex., and determine if there were any alternatives available for temporary continuation of the program beyond today.

It is possible the regional office of the OEO could designate the Community Action Agency in Otero County. Regional OEO officials indicated this as a possibility in a recent letter to Cargo.

But state OEO director Rudy Baca contended a designation by the governor or by the regional OEO office is meaningless unless it is endorsed by the county commission.

"If the county commission doesn't want it, there is nothing we can do to override that decision." Baca said.

Martinez asked the governor to it in writing that he supported by the regional OEO office and recognize the regional office's authority to designate the agency. This Cargo declined to do.

There was some discussion of the need to salvage the Head Start program now under the direction of the local CAA.

Cargo suggested that it might be saved by placing it under direction of the Alamogordo public school system.

public school system.

But Cargo stood fast on his earlier position, based on a legal opinion from Atty Gen. James Maloney, that he has no authority under state law to make such a designation.

The problems with the program came to a head last fall when the Otero County Commission adopted a resolution withdrawing its designation of the county CAA. This had the effect of cutting off federal funding as of Dec. 31.

Maloney offered a temporary solution at today's meeting, which was accepted with some opposition from the Otero County group.

Maloney proposed that the Alamogordo City Commission, the Otero County Commission, the local CAA leaders and representatives from Operation SER, meet within 10 days to two weeks at the governor's request and attempt to work out a solution for continuation of the war on poverty programs in the county

Operation SER (Service Employment and Redevelopment) is a part of the federal Jobs for Progress program. It conducts manpower training programs and provides technical assistance, primarily among the Spanish-American population of the Southwest.

Robert Barela of Albuquerque, state director for Operation SER, offered the services of his office in attempting to reach a solution. This offer included sponsorship of the program in Otero County, if the county commission will redesignate the program.

Martinez and David Ortega of Alamogordo expressed the belief time and again there was no hope that the county commission would redesignate the program or that the Alamogordo City Commission would lend any support to continuation of the program. the program.

Cargo was critical of the CAA for engaging in partisan political activity, an allegation denied by Martinez.

And the governor said he felt a serious racial schism has de-

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
