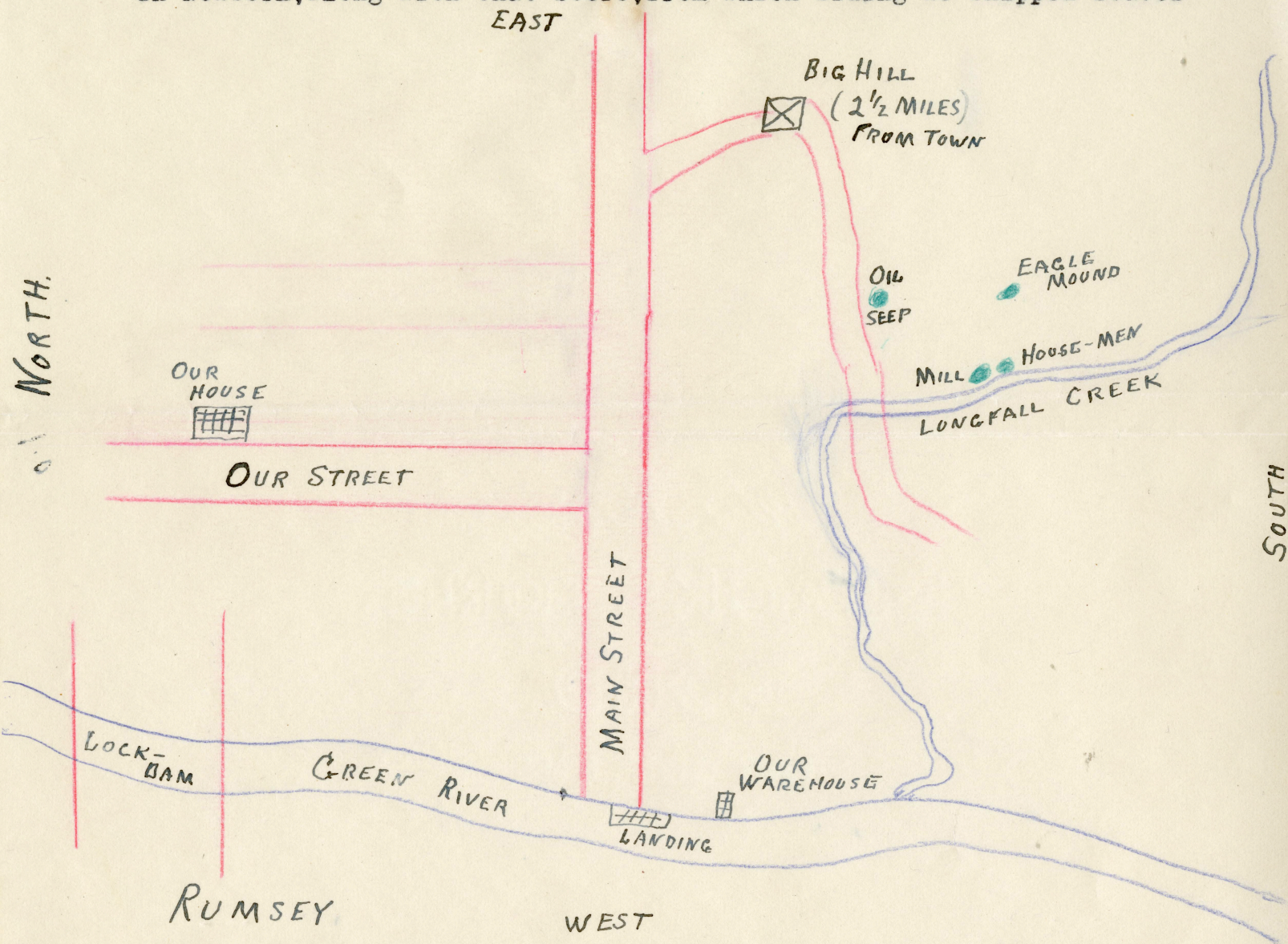


Regie, draw a map of Newbern and Calhoun, showing principal streets, where we lived, the mill locations and Green River-and the Odion, in Newbern, along with that store, from which siding we shipped staves



Harold: This is my recollection of the area about Calhoun, Ky. I think you may remember it more clearly than I do - for I was not there very long. I was away at school when the family moved there from McLeansboro in November 1900: I must have spent some time, not much, there the following summer; then went away again about Sept 1st 1900. I returned there about the last of June 1901 - for only some 4 weeks.

This map is not drawn to scale, of course, but is just my general recollection of the situation.

This was the most hopeless of all the moves Papa ever made; I guess somebody just told him that there was ash timber there and he just went ahead and moved; I do not believe he ever got out more than 2 or 3 car loads of staves - and I think the river rose and ruined one of these in the ware house.
