In re: Attached House Affairs Committee Print No. 189, dated April 1, 1964, and Print No. 40, dated April 12, 1961, both prints appear to be an excercise in typing for want of information and something to do in absence of the CHIEF.

No. 189, appears to be turn down on the hearing held in Corpus Christi and Harlingen, Texas, July 28, 1963.

No. 40, is a turn down to a hearing held in Washington, D.C., on April 12, 1961, which you will note is dated the same day that the hearing was held in Washington. Several County Commissioners and County Service Officers from our section attended this meeting and testified in behalfof a need for a hospital in South Texas.

Sent a \$11.00 night letter to Chairman Teague objecting to the allegations contained in number 189 print.

Sent a letter to the Director of the Budget in Washington requesting his office to examine and digest the minutes contained in the meetings held in Washington, D. C., on April 12, 1961 and San Antonio, Corpus Christi and Harlingen, during the month of July, commencing July 28, 1963, before the Director of the Budget makes its report to the Veterans Affairs Committee.

This office has been advised that the Veterans Affairs Committee will take no action on House Bills 1718 and 2019, until they hear from the Accounting office and other interested executive branches of the government. Such information was contained in the letter which transmitted to me print No. 189. I immediately searched my predecessor's files and found print numbered 40, as well as copies of of the minutes of the aforestated Washington meeting.

I have been advised that I will be notified concerning any future action that may be taken by the House Veterans Affairs committee.

I have also requested copies of the minutes of the meetings held in San Antonio, Corpus Christ and Harlingen, now of record with the Veterans Affairs Committee in Washington. This is a large order. Whether same may be mailed without expens to me, remains to be ascertained.

As, if and when such minutes are received they will be turned over to Attorney's in the valley who presented the testimony at the Harlingen, Texas, meeting for digest.

I am also advised as of yesterday that the Administrator of the Veterans Administration, Mr. John S. Gleason is now making a so-called current economy review, which may turn out to be road block for our hospital in South Texas.

I shall mark time until I hear further from Washington.
