
Leadership Corpus Christi,

sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce Foundation, is an annual series of educational programs focusing on significant community information and issues. The purpose of the program is to identify, educate, and motivate business and community leaders by developing their potential for leadership by exposing them to the diverse realities, personalities, and challenges in our community. It is the intent of the program to provide potential leaders with knowledge that they will use to aid their involvement in community affairs.

Up to forty participants, along with two alternates, will be selected to represent a cross-section of backgrounds, interests, and business and civic ties—a Corpus Christi community in miniature. The nine month program will be coordinated by graduates of previous LCC classes and staff members of the Corpus Christi Chamber of Commerce.

Participants will be selected by an anonymous committee comprised of LCC alumni and representatives from the business community, the public sector, and community-based organizations or programs. Each member of the committee will review each application and make preliminary recommendations. Personal information will be omitted from each application to maximize objectivity. The final selection of participants will be made in full committee with personal information available and the goals of the LCC program considered. Participants will be notified of their selection after August 1, 1990.

Leadership Corpus Christi is funded primarily by contributions from the community and thus is offered to selected participants at a nominal cost of \$250 each, payable at the Commitment Meeting. Scholarship assistance is available on request. A \$10 processing fee must accompany each application.

How do you plan to use the education you gain from the LCC program?

As I have been and am involved in Hispanic rights and causes, I will couple this with my other educational achievements and endeavors. Applying this to continue and better serve such causes while proving that in the Corpus Christi area we are integrating Hispanics into local Leadership in the due percentages reflective of the local populace.

In your judgement, what are the three most pressing problems facing the Corpus Christi area today? State your choices and give specific recommendations for approaching and/or resolving these problems.

1 Education: I recommend local government to have a tighter reign on the local school system and be kept abreast of policies and programs. Cultural diffussion and education of different ethnic backgrounds should be stressed to diminish ethnic polarization; Overcoming ignorance by education will make for a more integrated and understanding community. Continual examination of other district programs with feed back by Superintendents of impact to their district.

2 Driving while Intoxicated: Propose County Atty. to set up a "Diversion Program" to educate and rehabilitate first time offenders. This program would screen such offenders having them fill out questionnaire, and interviewed by a counselor to determine if they would be receptive and benefit from program. Dependent upon counselors determination, they would be set up for requirement of attendance to 2-6 Alcoholics Anonymous meetings per week and issued attendance cards. An Alcoholic Awareness class would be required along with monthly progress interview.

3 Packery Channel Proposal: This would disrupt the already strained medium of beach which is most favored by beach goers and tourists. I recommend we make the boat pass at the already established Mustang Island fish pass. It would cost less to improve the existent fish pass than to make a new pass while also disrupting a great tourist area.

What other things should the selection committee know about you to make an intelligent decision regarding our application for the 1990-91 Leadership Corpus Christi program?

Eligibility Requirements For Participants

Priority will be given to applicants who have demonstrated leadership potential or ability in one or more organizations or activities related to the betterment of Corpus Christi. Persons who are, at the time of participant selection, a publicly elected official (except for precinct chairmen) will not be eligible. A husband and wife cannot both be participants in the same class. Prior non-acceptance of an applicant does not adversely affect future consideration for selection. It is understood that the program is designed primarily for young potential leaders, but no exclusion shall be made solely on the basis of age.

Schedule and Attendance Requirements

Meetings will be held the second Thursday of each month from noon to 6:00 pm from October through April. Overnight weekend retreats will be held in September and May. The schedule for the 1990-91 LCC class is as follows:

Attendance at the above meetings, as well as four designated activities related to the LCC program, is mandatory. There are no excused absences. Absences from meetings or retreats totaling, in the aggregate, 12 hours, or five occasions of either late arrival or early departure, or failure to attend the designated activities, will result in the automatic dismissal of a participant.


