Dear Dr. Garcia:

Thank you for your letter of 24 February. I gave your cousin, Moe, a call and found that he is in Bogotá. His wife told me that for all interests and purposes he has been out of Caracas December, January, and February. Apparently his magazine is making a cover story of the Western Latin American Republics, and Moe has had to meet with the other magazine representatives in Lima and other places. His absence was unusual and so long that his wife went to Lima to spend some time with him.

They are all well and have been receiving your letters and information. However, Moe apparently is the kind of person who just will not sit down and write a brief note. He feels that when he writes a letter there has to be something worthwhile, hence you have not heard from him. As he will be back in Caracas next Saturday, you will probably hear from him some time shortly after that.

Life continues at a fast pace in Caracas. I find it hard to believe that we have been here for a year and a half and that our tour is now half over. As we will probably be going to Washington, we will no doubt see you there some time in the next two years.
